Draft AGM Motions to be proposed by the Committee

Outings

During 2019 only one of the three proposed outings attracted sufficient support to break even. The Committee held a thorough discussion of this topic in January, while reviewing the results of the recent survey. Some of the feedback suggested that outings should be subsidised from our reserves to avoid the disappointment of a cancellation, as happened to the Fort Nelson trip planned for July 2019. We have endeavoured not to lose money on outings or events, but occasionally this has not been possible. In the light of the comments, we felt the subject was worthy of discussion at the AGM and we therefore intend to propose this motion:

That this Meeting:

- 1. Confirms that the Association should continue to organise outings;
- 2. Recommends the Committee to:
 - a. Price outings to break even at 40 participants, varying this figure in the light of experience; and
 - b. Subsidise outings at up to £150 per trip from reserves.

Recently prices have been set to break even at 25 participants, but the feeling is that this makes prices too high. In the past the break-even figure was 40, but with reduced interest this was reduced to try to avoid losses. If the motion is passed prices would reduce but the likelihood of losses is increased. However, the Association has significant reserves, so this would be tenable for a few years.

Amendment to Constitution

The Committee have been considering the annual calendar of ARCO events. At present our Constitution lays down that the AGM must be held in March and this restricts the options to rearrange dates. Therefore the Committee is proposing the following motion at the AGM:

That Rule 7 of the Constitution be amended to "An Annual General Meeting shall be held in each year and shall appoint a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer, Social Secretary and such other officers as may be deemed necessary."

At present Rule 7 is "The Annual General Meeting shall be held in March each year and shall appoint a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer, Social Secretary and such other officers as may be deemed necessary."

Royal Engineers Museum Friday 3rd April 2020

The Royal Engineers story is one of courage, innovation, skill and endurance told through the many galleries. Follow the evolution of the Sappers from military architects and specialists in siege craft, to everything from diving to surveying, flying to photography and transport to combat engineering. The varied collections range from Victoria Crosses to Wellington's map of Waterloo, Chinese silks and the world's first guided torpedo, weapons from the Zulu War to an enormous V2 Rocket. Other highlights include Indian battle axes, bridge laying tanks, Zulu shields, a chunk of the Berlin Wall and a Harrier Jump Jet. The REM collection is designated as being of historical and international importance. Step-free access for wheelchair users and visitors with limited mobility. Large Print Guides.

Outside there are many tanks and other military vehicles with a picnic area. The Courtyard Cafe is located at the heart of the Museum, it offers hot drinks, snacks and light refreshments. The Museum has a small shop.

On the outgoing trip we shall stop off at Polhill, a family owned and run shopping village for a comfort/coffee break. This is a wheelchair/limited mobility friendly venue with disabled toilet. There is an outside area suitable for those with their own refreshments.

The trip is open to friends and family of ARCO members and Friends of Kingston Museum.

A message from the Mayor's Office ...

Do you have any old mobile phones you don't use anymore?

If so, you can be part of a big, green charity recycling drive from Kingston Council, in collaboration with the Mayor's Charitable Trust, which is launching in February.

The council is teaming up with local e-waste recycling company GSUK for the Mobile Mop-up project. We are inviting people to hand over old, unused mobile phone handsets to be recycled.

Phones will be sent to the GSUK recycling plant to be data-wiped, meaning all your information will be disposed of safely and securely. The team will then breathe new life into your old handset so it can be used again, or it will be stripped for parts if beyond repair. You don't have to drop off a phone charger - just a handset is fine.

Profits from the drive will go towards the Mayor's Charitable Trust, which in 2019/20 is fundraising for Kingston Centre for Independent Living (KCIL) and Oxygen (a local youth work charity), and you can return any unused phones - there are no limits on the age or model.

We will be launching the Mobile Mop-up Project in the week commencing 24th February and for 2 weeks Freepost envelopes will be available at the borough libraries, leisure centres and at the Guildhall so people can Freepost their phones into the scheme.

Please bring any phones for donation with you to the ARCO AGM on 18 March (which will be at the Guildhall) as there will be a collection box on site.

Remember to support this recycling project where proceeds are going to the Mayor's Charitable Trust.

And if you cannot attend the AGM, please use the freepost envelopes or drop to a public site.

The Council has an information page on its website at <u>www.kingston.gov.uk/mobilemopup</u>. This will be continually updated with information, including the locations of public drop off sites and envelope collection sites, etc. Due to Royal Mail rules, you must use one of the special envelopes.

Since the Newsletter was dispatched, we have been informed that Freepost envelopes will not be provided, so please disregard those references.
